## **UPDATE 08/17/12:**

The August 16th "Shred Day" event sponsored by the Newport News Sheriff's Office served hundreds of citizens helping to protect them from falling victim to identity theft. Stealth Shredding, Inc. brought three large trucks, each of which was almost filled. They estimate approximately 26,000 pounds of paper was destroyed. Synergy Electronics also collected a large load of unwanted electronics. The recycling firm partners with The Arc of the Virginia Peninsula, a non-profit organization that provides employment opportunities for individuals with developmental and other disabilities. They will be the ones who breakdown the electronics for recycling. The Lion's Club mobile van was busy providing citizens with eye and hearing exams. And The Home Depot, one of many exhibiters, kept children busy with its Kids Workshop teaching painting, hammering, and other crafty skills.

All of the services were provided free of charge.

The next "Shred Day" will take place in April, 2013 and will coincide with the DEA Drug Take Back.

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), nine-million Americans have their identities stolen each year. What do the thieves do with those identities? The can rent an apartment, obtain a credit card, and establish utility accounts in the victim's names, etc. The victim may not discover the theft until a debt collector comes knocking.

Something *new this year: electronics collection*. Synergy Recycling has agreed to collect unwanted electronic equipment free of charge. One other free service will be provided by the Oyster Point Mariner Lions Club. They will be offering sight and hearing tests for all ages.
