The adult detention facility, or jail annex, was dedicated on December 1, 2008 following a year of renovations to the former juvenile detention facility. The annex will house more than one hundred male and female inmates. It is a lowmedium risk facility which will be used to house those inmates enrolled in programs. The goal is to help individuals be productive citizens upon their release. For example, they will earn GEDs, learn the basics of brick masonry, be certified in culinary arts, and participate in work release.

The building was first dedicated January 25, 1964 as the Municipal Building, housing courtrooms and a limited number of juvenile detention cells. An expansion for additional juvenile detention cells was completed in June of 1988. Juvenile detention vacated the building January, 2005 and moved to a new facility.

On December 1, 2008, the Newport News Sheriff's Office dedicated the building as its jail annex. It has 108 beds, five housing units, three classrooms, two multipurpose rooms and a kitchen.

In addition to providing rehabilitative programs, the adult detention facility provides an intermediate solution to the overcrowded dangerously conditions in the main jail located 26^{th} on Street. Those conditions place overcrowded deputies in harms way. With the additional bed space, sworn law enforcement officers will work in a safer environment.



Lt. Col. Eileen Sprinkle oversaw the completion of this renovation project. She worked closely with engineers, contractors and vendors to ensure the project was on schedule. In addition to thanking the colonel, I want to extend my appreciation to our maintenance crew lead by Sgt. Brian Murray, Deputy Kenneth Jackson and Corporal Terry Jones. There is never a project too large for these individuals. The pride they invested in watching the annex take shape rubbed off on their trustees who put their backs into the renovation. Captain Terry Moore and his deputies assigned to work in the adult detention facility also dove right in with finishing touches. They were not afraid to get their hands dirty. They spit polished this building and made sure it shined for the official ribbon cutting.

Members of the public dropped by all day long to take advantage of our open house tours of the annex prior to inmate occupation.
